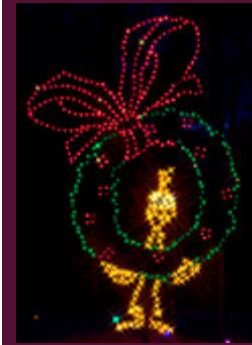
A Grand Time at the Bright Nights Ball
